Parts of Speech

- **Noun** (Name of a person, place & things)
 - Eg: Mohan, Delhi, Gold
- **Pronoun** (used in place of noun)
 - Eg: My, I, We, They, You
- **Adjective** (Definition of noun or pronoun)
 - Eg: Brilliant, very, truly
- **Verb** (Doing word. It tells as what a noun or a pronoun is doing or has done)
 - Eg: Sleep, run, walk, work

- **Adverb** (Defines an adjective, a verb or another adverb)
 - Eg: Fast, very, quickly, happily, early
- **Preposition** (relationship of a noun or a pronoun with the remaining part of the sentence)
 - Eg: At, from, to, by, into, across, of , on
- **Conjunction** (Joins two words, phrases, clauses or sentences)
 - Eg: And, but, therefore
- **Interjection** (Used to express sudden out burst of some strong feeling or emotion such as joy, sorrow, regret, surprise, contempt)
Eg: Hurrah, Alas, Ah, Wow

Prepositions

- **Simple Prepositions :**

- At, by, for, from, in, of, off, on, out, through, till, to, up, with

- **Compound Prepositions :**

- Across, along, among, amongst, around, before, behind, below, beneath, beside, between, beyond, inside, outside, underneath, within, without

- **Phrase / Prepositional Phrases:**

- According to, along with, because of, by dint of, by means of, by virtue of, for the sake of, in accordance with, with reference to, in addition to, on behalf of, in case of, in compliance with, in favour of, in lieu of, in order to, in place of, with regard to, in reference to, in regard of, in spite of, instead of with, in the event of, on account of, according to, with a view to
