College Profile

Lord Nelson College, a government aided free public private college affiliated to Bharathidasan University, was founded in 1982 with its main campus at Madhavapatti city. The Institute

Institute's general economic health can be measured by looking at the country's performance of economic system. An economic system is a system of resource allocation, production and distribution of goods and services in a society or a given geographic area. It includes the combination of the various institutions, agencies, entities, abstract trading processes, and

patterns of institutions that comprise the economic structure of a given community. As such, an economic system is a type of social system. The study of production is a related concept. All economic systems attempt to answer three fundamental questions, viz., what to produce, how to produce and to what quantities, and who receives the output of production. There are two major economic systems viz., Communism and Capitalism. Each of these economic systems includes some variants like Socialism, Market Economy, Welfare Capitalism, etc. which is. Economic System of the country is determined by the level of education of the people and the resources and the extent of Government Intervention. The task of economic theory such as poverty, inequality, unemployment, regional development, etc., is to be seen as one or more features of the economic systems. Thus, the mission of the contemporary economic theory should be directed by understanding the features of the economic systems. However, the very aim of the course is to provide the large, motivated students with the features of various economic systems throughout the world in India. This will help to recognize and evaluate the features of existing economic system to address the contemporary economic issues.
