ABOUT THE SEMINAR

As the youth population in India has been increasing over the years, so have the opportunities and problems for them. The youth today faces with much greater pressures of coping with their living as compared with their parents. In most cases they have to move away from their parents to urban cities, some of them even settling in foreign countries. Housing, transport, medical services, care of the children, education of the children is some of the issues faced by the youth before marriage. Lack of social/familial support and guidance lay great personal responsibility on the youth to evolve their own life styles to successfully adapt to the society, keeping in view the social and family norms and expectations. Many a youth do not wish to conform to the social and familial norms and they wish to live in the society with

unconventional value systems. In the last few years, due to socio-economic and political factors, there have been increasing health problems among the youth: unemployment, suicide, alcoholism, sex-related offences and general adjustment problems in the youth. Today, the youth in India form one of the most vulnerable groups, who on the one hand are expected to be the leaders to determine the destiny of India, and on the other hand, are the exploited and confused group.

In recent times they are facing the challenges from modern urban society, drastically changing environment, confronting media messages and pressures of peers to break free of various codes of the society. Youth concerns receive brief mention in assessments of mental health, violence and injury prevention, and HIV/AIDS prevention and care. Youth sexual and reproductive health is as yet largely underprotected by effective laws and policies. There is an urgent and ongoing need to address young people's sexual and reproductive health using a preventive, rights-based, gender-responsive and empowering approach. The sexual reproductive health problems are steeply rising in terms of teenage marriage and pregnancy, teenage pregnancy outside marriage, sexually transmitted infections and HIV/AIDS. In this context the seminar explores the serious health challenges of this vulnerable group facing within the context of local and global development. Socio-economic, cultural, educational and other factors affecting young people's health are examined, and reference is made to particular issues and areas of concern. Emphasis is given to the importance of involving young people in identifying problems and developing solutions to ensure that programmes, policies and health services address for their needs.

OBJECTIVES OF THE SEMINAR

1. To provide an insight about the health status of youth.
2. To identify the health issues of youth.
3. To discuss the prior issues relating to youth problems.
4. To know the impact of development programmes launched by the state and central governments on youth health.
5. To discuss and to develop strategies for improving the health status of the youth and the need based health services for the target groups.
6. To provide an exposure on the remedial measures in handling the youth problems.
7. To work towards a policy framework which recognizes youth health as an area of concern.
